

VICTOR VASARELY

- Born: 4-9-1906, Hungary
- Died: 3-15-1997, France
- Credited for being the creator and leader of the Op Art movement.

IMPORTANT FACTS

- 1965 "The Responsive Eye"
- Influenced by Abstract and Expressionist movements by de-emphasizing (or even eliminating) representational subject matter - recognizable
- People ready for new & fun



OP ART

A visual art style that uses precise patterns, mathematics, abstract shapes, non-representational objects and color (or black & white) to create OPtical illusions.

INSTRUCTIONS

- Background: Lightly draw parallel lines going across paper. Use both sides of the ruler.
- 2. Draw a simple object that is round in nature, like a heart or a circle.
- Draw curved lines from side of the round object to the other to create dimension and movement. (straight → curved → straight)
- 4. Color in bands, alternating the bands, like the American flag. Only use 2 -3 colors

THE 1960'S

- Assassination of JFK

OP ART DIRECTION

- Use of precision, mathematics, stark contrast, and abstract shapes to achieve
 - Foreground and background confusion
 - Exaggerated depth of field
 - Implied movement

1965 EXHIBITION OF OP ART: "THE RESPONSIVE EYE"

OP ART WAS INFLUENCED BY ABSTRACT AND EXPRESSIONIST MOVEMENTS BY DE-EMPHASIZING (OR EVEN ELIMINATING) REPRESENTATIONAL SUBJECT MATTER.
